Mikasa & Saru Shima

Run Ashore. We would love you and your family to join us on our day out to visit on board the Mikasa and then to walk short a distance to the boat that will take us to <u>Saru Shima</u>.

As you may be aware, the Mikasa was the Flagship of the fleet that, under Admiral Heihachiro Togo, annihilated the Russian Baltic Fleet and brought Japan to a historical and decisive victory in the Japanese-Russo War, thereby securing Japan's independence and increasing her international standing.

The famous <u>Togo Turn</u> maneuver still studied today, can be heard through this podcast.

This Battle of Tsushima was also instrumental in giving hope and confidence to nascent Asian and Arabic nations, as well as personally to later leaders, like Prime Minister Nehru of India and President Sun Yat Sen of the ROC, in their respective achievements.

Saru Shima ("Monkey Island" bereft of monkeys) is the only natural island in Tokyo Bay and a lovely little spot for a day's excursion. The outing will be around six hours so please bring a packed lunch that we can enjoy on the island before a leisurely walk around the island and visiting the pre-war battlements and the red brick barracks.

If you would like to join please reply to this email so we can gage interest. The cost of the ferry to the island is ¥1300 for adult and ¥600 for elementary students, children below elementary school age are free.

The Mikasa is ¥500, with any child under 15 free.
